Weighted average market capitalization is a type of market index in which each component is weighted according to the size of its total market capitalization. Market capitalization is the sum of the total value of a company's outstanding shares multiplied by the price of one share. The price/book ratio compares a firm's market capitalization to its book value. It is calculated by dividing the company's stock price per share by its book value per share. The debt/capital ratio is a measurement of a company's financial leverage. It is calculated by dividing a company's total debt by its total capital, which is total debt plus total shareholders' equity.
- a. Total gross exposure is an estimate of a portfolio's exposure to all market activity (up or down markets). By finding the absolute value of our long and short exposure, one finds that 91.0 of the Fund's capital is exposed to market fluctuations.
- b. Total net exposure is an estimate of a portfolio's exposure to directional moves in the market. So while 91.0% of the portfolio is expected to move with market movements in either direction (total gross exposure) we would expect our portfolio to move 91.0% (net exposure) in the same direction as the market (*ceteris paribus*). c. Total gross shorts (II) are not included in "Total Portfolio" as sale proceeds from the short sale are used to collateralize the position.
